

Religion Education

Religion Education is one facet of the faith formation that permeates the Frassati Catholic Academy experience. Our school educates our students about the basic Catholic principles focusing on Christian virtues and values bringing students to a better understanding of their faith by strengthening their relationship with Christ. Our school offers a unique approach to this education by introducing the Beatitudes and using our school's namesake, Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati as a role model and example of how one can live their life through the teachings of Jesus Christ our Savior.

Classes increase understanding through study of the Bible, the history of the Catholic Church, liturgy, sacraments, the Beatitudes and the teachings of Pier Giorgio Frassati the man. Preschool through middle school students participate in daily classroom prayer, Kindergarten through 8th grade attend weekly liturgy, while preschool students join them once per month. Students participate in masses as readers, cross bearers, altar servers, gift bearers, and members of the choir or bells. Additionally, students are encouraged to participate in PADS, Missions Club, Bible Study, Feed My Starving Children events and more. Parents are welcome to attend mass at either campus with the children, as well as special masses that occur throughout the year. In addition to celebrating weekly mass as a school community, sacramental preparation for reconciliation and first Eucharist occurs in 2nd Grade and Confirmation in 8th grade.

Along with daily classes, students benefit from service projects at all grade levels, faith experiences such as the Living Rosary, Stations of the Cross, Adoration, May Crowning and visits from parish priests who engage students to share their faith experiences.
