

Frassati Yearbooks Available for Pre-Order at 15% Discount

Yearbooks are now available to be pre-ordered online through the TreeRing website. All families and students have been set up in the system and parents should be receiving invitations to the web site via email soon (if they haven't already).

The prices for the Yearbook have gone up slightly (\$1.00) from last year. The Elementary Yearbook is \$16.00 and the Middle School Yearbook is \$17.00. However, if parents place their orders before September 30th (the end of this month), they can save 15% off the regular price, which is a lot more than the \$1.00 price increase. In addition the more books are ordered early, the more free extra copies the school can get.

The TreeRing yearbook program also

provides parents the opportunity to have 2 completely custom pages where they can put in their own photos and content, personalizing the Yearbook for their student. The 2 custom pages are no additional cost. Extra custom pages can be added at \$1.00 for each 2 page spread. Custom Pages do not have to be finalized until May of next year, giving folks plenty of time to compile their own photos throughout the school year.

The books also have a hardcover upgrade option (for \$6.95). The hardcover also puts in some extra blank pages (great for allowing students more room to get fellow students to sign their books).

Ordering yearbooks from TreeRing is easy. People can respond to the email invitation and click the "purchase" link. You can also go directly to treering.com and confirm their account with the proper school code.

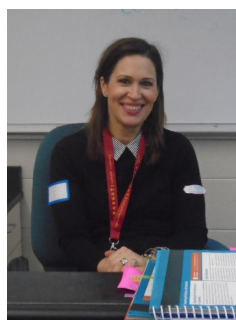

Spider-Man Swings into Theaters with Far From Home, Swings Out of MCU

Spiderman: Far From Home "swung" into theaters on July 7. Following the events of *Avengers: Endgame* (2019), Spider-Man must step up to take on new threats in a world that has changed forever, such as mysterious villains that arise on his prolonged class trip. The movie was directed by Jon Watts and the cast includes Tom Holland, Jake Gyllenhaal, Samuel L. Jackson, Zendaya, Marisa Tomei, and Jon Favreau

It topped all other Spiderman movies, grossing \$1,124,329,952 worldwide. On Rotten Tomatoes it earned a "tomatometer" score of 90% and is ranked 95% by audiences. One critic's review (Josh Wilding) said "The perfect Spider-Man movie, *Far From Home* is an adventure for the web-slinger like no other and will leave fans talking for a long time to come." I agree with this review and in my opinion it was a great, humorous movie.

Sony, who owns the film rights to Spider-Man, released the film in partnership with Marvel Studios. The studios decided to share the profits after previous Spiderman movies weren't successful. But after the release of *Far From Home*, the deal is no off. Spider-Man will not be in the MCU going forward. Sony does have a timeline for Spider-Man and possibly a Venom-Spider-Man movie, but all ties to the MCU are cut.

One of the reported reasons MCU and Sony parted ways is that MCU asked for a 50/50 split of the profits. There is no verification that it was actually a 50/50 split (Some say that it was a 25/75 split). Another reason is that Sony was upset because Kevin Feige (president of Marvel Studios) was not focusing enough on the Spider-Man movies in favor of other MCU movies.

On Thursday September 5, 2019, the Frassati Cross Country team had their first cross country meet of the regular season. It was held at Cook Park in Wauconda from 4:00pm to about 5:00pm. This was a Conference Meet and Frassati runners will run against the same runners several times more this season. In addition to Frassati, the other conference teams at the meet were St. Patrick, St. Gilbert, St. Bede, St. Joe (Libertyville), Prince of Peace and HRK Eagles. Two other conference schools did not attend, Lake Forest Country Day School and East Lake Academy.

The meet was a JV and Varsity meet and as usual JV ran 1 mile and Varsity ran 2 miles. The races were ran as co-ed races meaning both girls and boys run the race together, however they are scored separately for team results. Frassati's JV Girls team came in 4th place out of the 7 teams. Mad-dy Gardner was the top Frassati runner and took 9th place in her first ever Cross Country race. Zadie Navarrete (13th place) also finished in the top half. Prince of Peace won the Girls JV race.

Frassati's JV Boys team came in 7th place against a very crowded field of runners. Sam Glasnovich was the top Eagle runner, finishing in 17th place. St. Joe's won the Boys JV race.

The Girls Varsity team only had 4 runners in the race (a full scoring team is 5 runners), but managed to take 6th place. Andrea Lazaro was the top Eagle taking 18th place. St. Pat's won the Girls Varsity race.

The Boys Varsity team finished very strong in 3rd place, only 1 point behind the 2nd place St. Bede's team and only 10 points behind the winning St. Gilbert's team! Michael Van Wiltenburg was the top

Eagle runner coming in 7th place. Luke Burkhalter (11th), Alex Castillo (16th) and Mariano Rodriguez (19th) all finished in the top half of runners.

8th grade Varsity girls runner, Lauren Zomchek said, "At first I was doing great, then I felt terrible, but ended up doing okay in the end." Most of the runners enjoyed the races they ran and were happy with their places and times.

Coach Huner was very happy with the performances at the meet. "After compiling the results after the races, I realized that every runner on our teams (that weren't running in their first race) set new Personal Records!", he said. "I don't think that I've ever seen a meet before where that's happened."

The Eagles next meet will be the Fox River Valley Cross Country Invite (hosted by Frassati Catholic Academy). It will once again be at Cook Park again next Thursday, Sept 12. The Eagles have invited several teams outside the conference to this meet.
